Explanation

Our Raise on Line does not show data for Writing at KS1 or KS2 and therefore the above table cannot be completed in full at this time. **The red text shows data that we are currently waiting for.**

There is a new progress measure which compares the progress made at the end of KS2 with pupils nationally who had similar prior attainment at KS1 in terms of scaled point scores. English writing progress scores differ from reading and maths due to teacher assessments being used.

A score of 0 means pupils in this school, on average, do as well at KS2 as those with similar prior attainment nationally.

A positive score means pupils in this school on average do better at KS2 than those with similar prior attainment nationally.

A negative score means pupils in this school on average do worse at KS2 than those with similar prior nationally. A negative score does not necessarily mean a school is below the floor (see explanation further on).

Floor standard 2016

A school will be above the floor if:

- At least 65% of pupils meet the expected standard in R,W and M

OR

- The school achieves sufficient progress scores in all three subjects. At least -5 in Reading, -5 in maths and -7 in writing.

We are awaiting writing data from ROL but as our % of pupils who achieved the expected standard in writing is much higher than reading or maths, it is anticipated that the progress score will meet the above criteria.
