

<u>Tuesday 24 October, 9.15 for 9.30am in the Arts Centre in School</u> – KS1 (Years 1 and 2). Parents/carers and family will be required to sign in and out on a sheet at the Reception.

<u>Wednesday 25 October 2pm at the St Martins Parish Church</u> – KS2 (Years 3 – 6). Pupils will walk to the church so please only send them to school with minimal bags as they will need to carry them to the church. Pupils can be collected from the church after the service. Classes will be released individually. Please let class teachers know if a different adult is collecting your child as we will be unable to let pupils go if we haven't been informed prior to the day. We will aim to finish at 3pm allowing time to get back to school for 3.25pm if you need to pick up KS1 siblings up. There will be no after school clubs for KS2 pupils that day. Extended School will run as usual and pupils can walk back to school with staff with the children who are being collected at 3.25pm.
