

Year 5 Curriculum Snap Shot Autumn 1 2024

Title: Rebel Women Throughout History

Stunning Starter: Welcome to Year 5. Children will spend time settling in, team building and setting classroom expectations.

Magnificent Middle: What makes a good scientist? Fantastic Finish: How do I see me? Children Children will design investigations to explore forces, will create an abstract self-portrait.

English: Queen of the falls by Chris Van Allsburg

The children will write a series of diary entries including description, feelings, opinions, adverbial phrases, rhetorical questions and consistent use of first person.

Reading - Goodnight Stories for Rebel Girls by Elena Favilli Children will focus on drawing inferences about the character's thoughts, feelings and motives and making comparison with other texts that they have read. Class Novel - The Boy Who Swam with Piranhas by David Almond.

Spelling - Statutory spelling lists (year 5/6), words with a letter string e.g. 'ough', silent letters, words ending in 'ible' or 'able', homophones,

Handwriting - Practise the first join.

History Topic - The Viking and Anglo-Saxon struggle for the kingdom of England.

Spanish - Simple calculations based on the five times table, and leads into learning how to ask for and give the time. Learners also extend their food and drink vocabulary.
