Key text: Winter's Child by Angela McAllister

Other texts to support our learning: The Ice Palace by Robert Swindells (class novel Year 2 - 10 more, 10 less, add and subtract 10s, add 2-digit numbers (across to link)

Outcome: To write a fantasy story based on a fable

Year 2 - Use co-ordination (but, or) • Add -ly to turn adjectives into adverbs • Write for different purposes • Use commas to separate items in a list

Year 3 - Use conjunctions and adverbs to express, time, place and cause • Use a or an according to whether the next word begins with a vowel or consonant • In narratives, create characters, settings and plot • Use inverted commas to punctuate direct speechhumber, complements to 100, estimate answers, inverse operations and Handwriting: Revise letter formation and initial joins. Reading: Ice Palace by Robert Swindells Year 2: Introduce non-fiction books that are structured in different ways. Answer and ask questions.

Year 3: Ask guestions to improve understanding, Draw inferences (inferring characters' feelings, thoughts and motives from their actions) and justify with evidence. Discuss words and phrases that capture the reader's interest and imagination.

Spellings: homophones; prefixes and suffixes; prefixes 'mis-' and 're-'; the /i/ sound spelt 'y'; words ending with the /g/ sound spelt 'gue' and the /k/ sound spelt '-gue'
