English Main Text - Leon and the Space Between by by Grahame Baker Smith & Angela McAllister. The Big-Top Mysteries: The Case of the Vanishing Granny by Alexander McCall Smith.

Writing - Recounts, invitations, fliers, first person character perspectives, character descriptions.

Yr 4- Extend the range of sentences with more than one clause by using a wider range of conjunctions including when, if, because, although. Indicate possession by using the possessive apostrophe with plural nouns. Recognise the difference between plural and possessive 's'.

Yr 3- Use conjunctions and adverbs to express, time, place and cause. Use a or an according to whether the next word begins with a vowel or consonant In narratives, create characters, settings and plot. Use inverted commas to punctuate direct speech

SPAG - Standard English, conjunctions, main and subordinate clauses, apostrophes for possession, plural and possessive 'S'.

Handwriting - the Nelson scheme (og, re, oo, sl, ck, st, nk).

Knowledge & Understanding of the World including British Values and What's in the news & Where is in World?

History Unit - Local history - Chirk Castle. When was Chirk Castle built and who built it? Why and what for? The need for Chirk Castle as a strategic base.

Mathematics:

Yr 4: Add and subtract numbers with up to 4 digits using the formal written methods of columnar addition and subtraction where appropriates. Estimate and use inverse operations to check answers to a calculation. Convert between different units of measure [for example, kilometre to metre; hour to minute]. Measure and calculate the perimeter of a rectilinear figure (including squares) in centimetres and metres. Recall multiplication and division facts for multiplication tables up to 12 × 12 (ongoing throughout the term).

Yr 3- Calculation and arithmetic of addition and subtraction. To add and subtract numbers mentally. To add and subtract numbers using column methods. Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 3, 4 and 8 multiplication tables. Use place value, known and derived facts to multiply and divide mentally.
