Students in Years 8–10 recently took part in Everyone's Invited assemblies exploring how relationships are shaped by what we see in films, TV, and social media. Everyone's Invited is a UK charity and movement that works to expose and tackle sexual violence through education, conversation, and support.

The sessions challenged stereotypes—such as boys being expected to stay tough and girls being encouraged to “people please”—and showed how these pressures can affect behaviour. Through a relationship scenario, students discussed **consent, power imbalances, healthy communication, and empathy**, gaining a clearer understanding of what respectful relationships look like.
